EDITOR'S REPORT TO THE ASPT COUNCIL

One volume of *Systematic Botany Monographs* were published since June, 2008: vol. 86, Monograph of *Psittacanthus* (Loranthaceae), Job Kuijt, 361 pp, color frontispiece, hardbound, April 2009.

Four volumes are in press. One will be published on 6 July 2009: vol. 87, Monograph of the syncarpous African genera *Isolona* and *Monodora* (Annonaceae) by Thomas L. P. Couvreur, 150 pp, 3-page color insert. The other two will be published in early fall: vol. 88, Systematics of *Glossoloma* (Gesneriaceae) by John Littner Clark, 130 pp, color frontispiece; vol. 89, Monograph of *Artemisia* subgenus *Tridentatae* (Asteraceae–Anthemideae) by Leila M. Shultz, ca. 135 pp. One volume will go to composition in August and is expected to be published in December, 2009: vol. 90, Monograph of *Mitrephora* (Annonaceae), Aruna D. Weerasooriya and Richard M. K. Saunders.

Since June, 2008, four new manuscripts were submitted. One (vol. 90) is now in preparation to be sent to composition; one was positively reviewed and is in revision; two are in review. Three papers returned from revision are now in press (vols. 87, 88, 89). For most papers the time from submission to publication is 12 to 18 months.

In January, 2009, volumes 1–66 became available on-line through JSTOR; the “moving wall” is five years. New volumes are supplied to JSTOR at the time of publication.

SBM is financed entirely by sales of current and back volumes, subsidies from authors, and occasional gifts. Walter L. Meagher, who has so generously supported SBM for over 15 years, had donated \$1000 for publication costs of a future volume; his gift was applied toward the publication of volume 86. The authors of volume 86 and 87 contributed toward production costs. Volumes 86 and 88 include a color frontispiece paid for by the SBM Anderson fund.

As always, I thank the referees for their thorough and helpful reviews.
